Background: September 2001

<u>Task One:</u> Develop the optimal organization for management of all Homeland Defense activities of the Department

> ✓ February 2003 : Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Homeland Defense OASD HD established

<u>Task Two</u>: Develop operational solutions for Unity of Command and effort for HD activities

> ✓ October 2002 : United States NORTHERN Command established


<u>Task Three</u>: Integrate DoD planning and designated capabilities into the National HLS effort

> ✓ October 2001: General Lawlor assigned to the Office of Homeland Security



Homeland Security Landscape -National Strategy for Homeland Security

- <u>Strategic Objectives</u>
 - Prevent terrorist attacks within the United States
 - Reduce America's vulnerability to terrorism
 - Minimize damage and recover from attacks that occur
- <u>Critical Mission Areas</u>
 - Intelligence and Warning
 - Border and Transportation Security
 - Domestic Counterterrorism
 - Protecting Critical Infrastructure and Key Assets
 - Defending Against Catastrophic Threats
 - Emergency Preparedness and Response





Homeland Defense Roles and Missions <u>Definitions</u>

• <u>Homeland Defense</u>. The protection of U.S. sovereignty, territory, domestic population, and critical

defense infrastructure against external threats and aggression

• <u>Civil Support</u>. DoD support to U.S. civil authorities for domestic emergencies and for designated law enforcement and other activities

• <u>Emergency Preparedness</u>. Those planning activities undertaken to ensure DoD processes, procedures, and resources are in place to support the President and the Secretary of Defense in a designated National Security Emergency

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Assistant Secretary of Defense for Homeland Defense <u>Functions</u>

- Overall Supervision of the Homeland Defense Activities of the Department of Defense
- Develop Strategic planning guidance for DoD's role in Homeland Security
- Develop Homeland Defense force employment policy and guidance
- Supervise DoD preparedness activities to support civil authorities in domestic emergencies
- Assist civil authorities in building and improving Federal, State and local HLS response capabilities
- Plan, train and perform DoD domestic incident management
- Advocate Homeland Defense requirements within the Department's resource allocation process



HLS Implications for DoD

- Evolving national vision of military support to civilian authorities
 - Public safety/law enforcement v. national security
- Evolving DoD vision of domestic military activities
 - Role of NORTHCOM
 - Intelligence collection & sharing
- Evolving role of National Guard
 - o Protection of Critical Infrastructure Protection
 - Military preparedness and readiness
- Evolving role of Coast Guard
 - Expanding missions / Navy and Coast Guard roles and missions
- Evolving focus of National Laboratories
 - o Competition for limited resources / Economies of scale
- DoD direct support to HSC and DHS
 - Detail of intelligence personnel (LD/HD)
 - Other potential details to assist DHS in achieving Full Operational Capability
