

Advocacy Objectives

- Support U.S. defense companies' products and services in international procurement competitions.
- Identify and disseminate information on export market opportunities.
- Provide market intelligence and business counseling.
- Generate high-level, government-togovernment advocacy on behalf of U.S. firms competing for international defense projects.

Defense Trade Advocacy/ Export Promotion

Defense Trade Advocacy/ Export Promotion

- Ensuring strong U.S. defense industrial base exists to meet U.S. national security requirements

 - 50% preferred



- Competitors (domestic and foreign)



G-8 Government R&D Expenditures - 2001






G-8 Government Defense R&D Expenditures - 2001

NATO Defense Expenditures as % of Gross Domestic Product




Defense Expenditures Per Capita



U.S. Defense Exports by Category (\$ Millions)




