

Homeland Defense

 The protection of U.S. sovereignty, territory, domestic population, and critical defense infrastructure against external threats and aggression or other threats as directed by the President. The Department of Defense is responsible for Homeland Defense.

- Examples of domestic HD missions include:
 - Maritime Intercept Operations Maritime Domain
 - Combat Air Patrols Air Domain
 - Land-based defense critical infrastructure protection Land Domain



Defense Support of Civil Authorities

Often referred to as civil support, is DoD support, including Federal military forces, the Department's career civilian and contractor personnel, and DoD agency and component assets, for domestic emergencies and for designated law enforcement and other activities. DoD proves DSCA when directed to do so by the President or Secretary of Defense.

- Examples of DOD Civil Support missions include:
 - Consequence management for catastrophes, including CBRNE attacks
 - Equipment, training, and other materiel support to domestic law enforcement



DSCA Evaluating Criteria

- DoD evaluates requests according these criteria and may disapprove a request that fails to meet one or more of them
 - Legality (compliance with laws)
 - Lethality (potential use of lethal force by or against DoD Forces)
 - Risk (safety of DoD Forces)
 - Cost (who pays, impact on DoD budget)
 - Appropriateness (whether the requested mission is in the interest of the Department to conduct)
 - Impact on Readiness (impact on the Department of Defense's ability to perform its primary mission)
