

NATO PR CAPABILITIES

- Similar to the DoD in the early 1990's
 - Lack of resources
 - Lack of formal training for C²
 - Lack of joint emphasis



PR in ISAF

- International Security Assistance Force (ISAF)
 - Afghanistan
 - Approximately the size of Texas
 - Highest mountain up to 24,500 Ft
 - CJTF structure that is land centric
 - Each troop contributing nation limits COMISAF's authority with caveats




Execution of PR in Afghanistan

- Lack of situational awareness due to limited radar picture
- No AWACS coverage
- Poor low level radio coverage
- Combined Joint Statement of Resources (CJSOR)
 - No dedicated PR recovery platforms sourced

ISAF PR ISSUES

- Documentation and guidance
 - On different computer system
 - Security classification markings
- Communications
 - 4 different types of internet systems
 - STU IIB for NATO/STE for US



NATO Improvements in PR

- CC-Air Ramstein Rescue Controller's Course
- PR incorporated into exercises
- CC-Izmir is updating/rectifying guidance



Way Ahead

- Must recognize shift from war of survival to conflicts of choice
 - PR is insurance to maintain public support
- Must educate military and civilian leader to the value of PR
- Must make PR joint
- Must get PR billets at all levels



US Assistance

- 32nd Air Operations Center/USAFE
 - Exercise support
 - Training
- Joint Personnel Recovery Agency
 - Employment training at Joint Warfare Center
