

National Personnel Recovery System

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
- Capture, kidnapping and hostage-taking abroad threatens the collective security of the U.S. and our partner nations
 - Safe conduct of stabilization activities by all (diplomatic, military, economic) demands we address this transnational threat
 - Need to reduce risk to our people through prevention & preparation
- The National System will capitalize on interagency best practices and partner nation support options...this must not be a pick-up game
 - Establishes a framework to synchronize existing intelligence and operational capabilities to...
 - ✓ Prevent people from becoming isolated from friendly control (support)
 - ✓ Recover people <u>before</u> they are captured when forced to evade hostiles
 - ✓ Recover people if they are taken captive, kidnapped, or taken hostage
 - Reintegrate people back into society; prosecute those responsible for criminally-based captures...support partner nations to do the same
- The National Personnel Recovery System functions transparently whether Chief of Mission or Combatant Commander is in charge

Common Terms of Reference

• U.S. Definitions

- Personnel Recovery the sum of diplomatic, military, and civil efforts to prepare for, recover, and reintegrate people who become isolated from friendly control or captured abroad.
- Isolated Personnel those who are separated from friendly control; captured by hostile parties abroad; or forced into situations where they must survive, evade, resist, or escape.
- A national system must address several populations of people with varying degrees of risk abroad—as risk goes up so does training, support, and infrastructure requirements

Way Ahead & Conclusions

- A national strategy for the national personnel recovery system provides top-down direction and authorities
 - Draft strategy is in NSC staffing process...has CSG oversight
 - Planning to take document to the Deputies when ready
- Require departments/agencies to self-assess operational needs, organic capacity, and capabilities forward...functional gap analyses
 - Apply essential elements...use assessment matrix
 - Identify shortfalls and leverage others who have capacity

Formalize a national personnel recovery system

- Determine training and education base-lines
- Establish MOAs, MOUs, bilateral agreements
- Codify command and control arrangements
- Agree to interoperable equipment solutions
- Commit to an exercise/rehearsal schedule
