International Training



Many nations model their navy after USCG - Why?


- 80% of world's maritime services are more like us – identify with USCG not the military;
- USCG identifies seamlessly with both military/civilian organizations;
- Most host nations face maritime security threats not military defense threats; lends to USCG competencies – especially SAR.

The Coast Guard is:

 Only USG military agency with LE authority to board, search, seize and arrest;

World leader in maritime safety and security issues;

 COCOM's entrée into countries with strong military influence within government

National SAR Committee (NSARC)



- 1. NSARC is comprised of 6 federal agencies (DOT, DOC, DOI, DOD, NASA, FCC adding DHS...)
- 2. Promotes <u>federal</u> interagency SAR coordination and cooperation to meet domestic and international commitments
- 3. NSARC mutually developed:
 - National SAR Plan (NSP) being rewritten
 - National SAR Supplement (NSS)

International SAR Coordination and Cooperation



- 1.USCG has authority to negotiate SAR agreements with other nations:
 - Bilateral SAR MOUs
 - Multilateral SAR MOUs
 - SAR MOUs formalize international SAR Regions; identify national SAR mission POCs
- 2. U.S. participates in the Global SAR System; USCG represents U.S. interests in IMO



International Cooperation: Cospas-Sarsat Program



- 1. Satellite based distress alerting system
 - U.S. C-S partner agencies: NOAA, USCG, Air Force, NASA
 - C-S program nations: Russia, Canada, France, U.S.
 - 40 participating nations
- 2. Extensive, humanitarian international cooperation
