Scientific and Technical Information is Shared Through







GIDEP DATABASE - What's in it for you?





- Main Goal: Avoid having non-conforming materials become part of your product/system
 - reduce the risk of loss of life or property
- FED document types include:
 - ALERT's
 - SAFE ALERT's
 - Problem Advisories
 - Agency Action Notices
 - Lessons Learned



Problem Advisory, ALERT & SAFE ALERT

- Reports a Problem (functional failure)
 - Materials, parts, components, or sub-assemblies
 - Specification
 - Software
 - Facility
 - Manufacturing Process
 - Test Equipment
 - Has an unknown probability; or
 - Has a low probability of causing problems for other users
 - Loss of life or,
 - Property damage



Agency Action Notice

- An Agency Action Notice redistributes problem information issued by a government agency other than GIDEP
- An AAN "problem" can include just about anything
 - -- from nuclear reactors to surge protectors



DMSMS

- Occurs when a manufacturer decides to discontinue a product or product line
- DMSMS data elements:
 - Case number
 - Manufacturer information
 - Part identification
 - Important dates
 - Solution Code
 - Comments

GIDEP is the DoD's center for the acquisition, management and dissemination of DMSMS information.

Urgent Data Request (UDR)

Service to allow GIDEP participants to query information from the GIDEP community
